

# BTEC Nationals – L3 Certificate in Animal Management

*This course extends for 12 weeks of part-time study and has been specifically designed for students undertaking A Level sciences and planning to apply to study veterinary medicine or science at university. While having a strong practical basis in animal husbandry, the course also covers key elements of animal health and disease, with additional assessed coursework amounting to approximately 60 hours of private study.*

<b>The Course</b>	The BTEC Certificate in Animal Management is a practical, work related qualification. You learn by completing practical activities, projects and assignments that are based on realistic workplace situations, activities and demands. You build up credits by undertaking a range of units to achieve the qualification
<b>Course Content</b>	<p>The course consists of 4 units, successful completion of which achieves the minimum 30 credit value required for award of the BTEC Certificate in Animal Management, equivalent to 1AS level, Part-Time</p> <p><b>Units</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Understand and Promote Animal Health (10 credits)</li><li>• Undertake Animal Handling and Safe Working (10 credits)</li><li>• Plan and Monitor Animal Feeding (5 credits)</li><li>• Manage Animal Accommodation (5 credits)</li></ul>
<b>Qualification Gained</b>	<p>All units are assessed and graded as pass, merit or distinction with a point score for each grade. An overall grade for the qualification is awarded up to a Distinction and reflecting AS Level equivalence in UCAS point scores.</p> <p>Successful learners achieve the BTEC Certificate in Animal Management.</p> <p>Learners go into careers in areas such as veterinary practices, zoos, animal collections, stud farms, animal health product development or monitoring. Career opportunities are very diverse.</p> <p>Many learners progress to university and take degrees in subjects such as Animal Management, Veterinary Sciences, Zoology or Animal Behaviour.</p>
<b>Entry Requirements</b>	<p>You will normally need to have at least one of the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• a Level 2 Diploma in a related subject at Distinction, with D in a science unit</li><li>• a work related qualification at Level 2 with Functional Skills at least to L1</li><li>• at least four GCSEs at Grades A* - C, including English, Maths and Science</li><li>• Appropriate experience of working with animals</li></ul>
<b>Fees</b>	£360 inclusive of Awarding Body registration fees
<b>Venue</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Enfield</li></ul> <p><b>Note:</b> Prospective students will need to show a high level of dedication to the care and welfare of animals and be aware of the considerable commitment required for a successful and rewarding career in the animal care industry. A significant part of the practical work for the course takes place outside and students should be prepared for outdoor work in all weathers as well as having current tetanus vaccinations.</p>

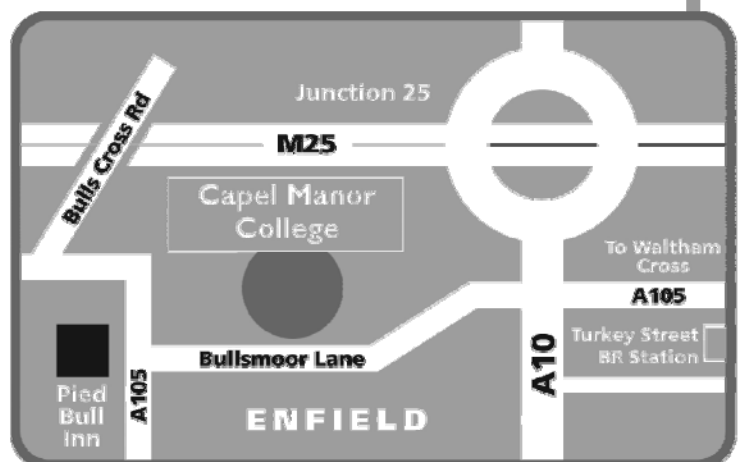
