<p>17. Apologies</p> <p>17.1. Apologies were given for Marilyn Hawkins.</p>	
<p>18. Declaration of Interests</p> <p>18.1. None.</p>	
<p>19. Minutes</p> <p>Resolved to</p> <p>19.1. Approve the minutes of the Academic Committee Part II meeting held on 11 March 2019 as a correct record and authorise the Chair to sign them.</p>	
<p>20. Student Disciplinary 2018-19</p> <p>20.1. The number of Gross Misconduct Hearings at the College are consistent with previous years.</p> <p>20.2. There are 21 resolved Gross Misconduct Disciplinary Hearings for the year so far, comprising 14 final written warnings, 4 exclusions who can reapply in 2020/21 and 3 permanent exclusions.</p>	

<p>20.3. More mental health issues amongst students is creating a higher demand for counselling. The Committee recognised that this is a national trend.</p> <p>20.4. The College has experienced slightly more disciplinaries related to drugs use this year. This may also be a growing national trend.</p> <p>20.5. As the Enfield site is larger, more incidents are recorded there. Governors noted that the larger site provided more opportunity for anonymity.</p> <p>20.6. Despite growth of the College 16-18 student body, only one additional incident was recorded in 2018-19, compared to the 2017-18, demonstrating no correlation between age and discipline.</p> <p>20.7. Governors noted that for students who had offended but remained in the College (where it is deemed safe), the subsequently improved behaviour, at a possibly crucial developmental point in their lives, confirms the supportive role that the College plays.</p>	
<p>21. Student Complaints Report 2018-19</p> <p>21.1. The College had 3 resolved complaints in 2018-19.</p> <p>21.2. Investigations into complaints resulted in satisfaction by all parties. This indicates that the College's appeals system appears to work well.</p>
