

Foundation Learning

Our Foundation Learning provision offers courses for young people who require one or two of additional learning before progressing onto vocational courses, an apprenticeship, a supported internship or employment. We support personal development and help students improve their skills, gain a qualification and progress onto further study or employment.

In addition, students will study for functional skills qualifications in Maths and English where necessary and, undertake a range of theory and practical hands-on activities in horticulture and animal management. Students will also develop skills in English, Maths and personal development.

Courses

Foundation Learning Programme in Land-Based and Environmental Studies (Level 1)

Available at our Crystal Palace Park, Enfield and Mottingham campuses

Units studied include:

- Practical introduction to horticulture
- Using craft skills with natural materials
- Exploring and presenting enterprise ideas (animal care focused unit)
- Working in a team (animal care focused unit)
- Managing social relationships
- Digital skills
- Numeracy skills

Foundation Learning Programme in Land-Based and Environmental Studies (Entry Level 3)

Available at our Crystal Palace Park, Enfield, Gunnersbury Park and Mottingham campuses

Units studied include:

- Developing confidence working with animals
- Assist with catching and restraining a small animal
- Use and maintain garden tools
- Garden maintenance skills
- Communication skills for group and teamwork

Foundation Learning courses are suitable for:

- 16 to 18-year-old students with few or no formal qualifications – full-time (3 days per week)
- 16 to 23-year-old students with an EHCP – full-time (3 days per week)
- 14 to 16-year-old students who have been home-schooled – part-time including English and Maths (2 days per week)
- 14 to 16-year-old students who are on school role – part-time excluding English and Maths. (1, 2 or 3 days per week)

Entry Points

Students can join us in September and January.

Please note, the size of the qualification will depend upon whether a student is full or part-time and, whether they join us in September or January.

Entry requirements

- Students must enjoy working outdoors with an interest in gardening, working with animals and taking part in practical activities.
- Students must be working at Entry Level 2 or above in English and Maths (this will be assessed via an initial assessment (BKSB) as part of the interview process if formal qualifications have not been achieved). This is approximately equivalent to a Year 8 secondary school literacy and numeracy level.
- If students have an EHCP, this will need to be viewed and assessed by our Learning Support team to ensure that we are able to meet need and put the appropriate support in place for the individual students.
- For health and safety, students need to have a tetanus injection and purchase steel toe-capped boots to wear for all practical sessions before they start at the College.

How to apply

16 to 18 year-old students with few or no formal qualifications

Complete the College application form via our website – the student's application will be processed and they will be contacted about next steps.

16 to 23-year-old students with an EHCP

Complete the College application form via our website. Include a copy of the student's EHCP which will be viewed and assessed by our Learning Support team. This is to ensure that we are able to meet the needs of the student and put the appropriate support in place for them. Their application will then be processed and they will be contacted about next steps. The student's local authority will also need to be informed about applying to study at Capel Manor College so that they can consult with us, and if we can meet the student's needs, name Capel Manor College as the education provider on their EHCP.

14 to 16-year-old students who have been home schooled

Complete the College application form via our website. If the student has an EHCP, include a copy of their EHCP which will be viewed and assessed by our Learning Support team to ensure that we are able to meet their needs and put appropriate support in place for them. The student must also submit a document from their local authority to confirm that they are not on school role. Their application will then be processed and they will be contacted about next steps. The student will also need to inform their local authority that they are applying to study at Capel Manor College so that they can consult with us, and if we can meet the student's needs, name Capel Manor College as the education provider on their EHCP.

14 to 16-year-old students who are on school role

Enquiries must come from the school who should contact the tutors below, depending on which campus a student wishes to attend. Once an enquiry is received, tutors will respond and request further information as required. If students have an EHCP, this must be assessed before an offer can be made and any support required by the student must be provided by the school.
