Foundation Learning

Our Foundation Learning provision offers courses for young people who require one or two years of additional learning before progressing onto vocational courses, an apprenticeship, a supported internship or employment.

In addition, students will study for Functional Skills qualifications in maths and English where necessary and, undertake a range of theory and practical hands-on activities in horticulture and animal management.

Courses

Foundation Learning Programme in Land-Based and Environmental Studies (Level 1)

Available at our Enfield, Gunnersbury Park and Mottingham campuses

Units studied include:

- Practical introduction to horticulture
- Using craft skills with natural materials
- Exploring and presenting enterprise ideas (animal care focused unit)
- Working in a team (animal care focused unit)
- Managing social relationships
- Digital skills for work
- Check a small animal is healthy

Foundation Learning Programme in Land-Based and Environmental Studies (Entry Level 3)

Available at our Enfield, Gunnersbury Park and Mottingham campuses

Units studied include:

- Developing confidence working with animals
- Assist with catching and restraining a small animal
- Use and maintain garden tools
- Garden maintenance skills
- Communication skills for group and teamwork

Foundation Learning courses are suitable for:

- 16 to 18-year-old students with few or no formal qualifications full-time (3 days per week)
- 16 to 23-year-old students with an EHCP with few or no formal qualifications fulltime (3 days per week)
- 14 to 16-year-old students who are attending school and wish to experience a landbased curriculum – part-time (1 to 2 days per week), this must be with the approval and funding of the school.

Entry Points

Students can join us in September and January.

Please note, the size of the qualification will depend upon whether a student is full or parttime and, whether they join us in September or January.

Entry requirements

- Students must enjoy working outdoors with an interest in gardening, working with animals and taking part in practical activities.
- Students must be working at Entry Level 2 or above in English and maths (this will be
 assessed via an initial assessment (BKSB) as part of the interview process if formal
 qualifications have not been achieved). This is approximately equivalent to a Year 8
 secondary school literacy and numeracy level.
- If students have an EHCP, this will need to be viewed and assessed by our Learning Support team to ensure that we are able to meet need and put the appropriate support in place for the individual students.
- For health and safety, students need to have a tetanus injection and purchase steel toe-capped boots to wear for all practical sessions before they start at the College.

How to apply

16 to 18 year-old students with few or no formal qualifications

Complete the College application form via our website – the student's application will be processed and they will be contacted about next steps.

16 to 23-year-old students with an EHCP

Complete the College application form via our website. You will need to include a copy of the student's EHCP which will be viewed and assessed by our Learning Support team. This is to ensure that we are able to meet the needs of the student and put the appropriate support in place for them. Their application will then be processed and they will be contacted about next steps. The student's local authority will also need to be informed about applying to study at Capel Manor College so that they can consult with us, and if we can meet the student's needs, name Capel Manor College as the education provider on their EHCP.

14 to 16-year-old students who are attending school and wish to experience a land-based curriculum on a part-time basis on our School Links provision

The student's school should contact the Head of Foundation Learning to discuss the student's suitability to join the course, if it is agreed in principal that the College can offer a place subject to interview and any assessment of EHCP support needs the school or parent should complete an application form, which will be supplied following the initial discussion, upon receipt of the application form the student will be invited for interview. If the student has an EHCP, include a copy of their EHCP with the application form which will be viewed and assessed by our Learning Support team to ensure that we are able to meet their needs and put appropriate support in place for them. The student's school is responsible for paying the fees for 14 – 16 part-time provision and these fees must be agreed in advance of the school or parent submitting an application.
