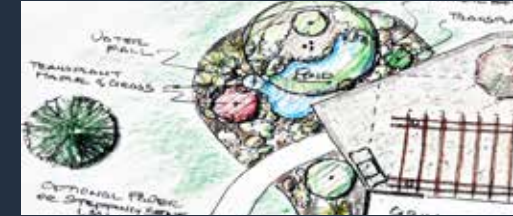

Foundation learning

Our foundation learning provision offers courses based around The Prince's Trust programme and is designed to help young people aged 16 to 19, bridge the gap between their current educational status and their future goals.

These courses are aimed at those who need an additional year of learning before progressing onto vocational courses or apprenticeships, or for those who have been out of education, employment, or training and need to develop their personal skills, qualities, and attitudes.

Students will undertake a range of class-based and practical hands-on activities, introducing them to the various areas of the land-based industry. In addition, students will study for qualifications in English and maths where necessary and, undertake a range of theory and practical, hands-on activities. English and maths

If you are aged 19 and over, and want to improve your numeracy skills, we offer free online courses in maths as part of the London Multiply programme. You can also achieve a formal qualification with GCSE English Language or Maths, or boost a lower existing grade.

If you have just finished school and have not obtained a pass in GCSE English or Maths, you will be able to study these alongside your chosen land-based course. We offer a unique learning environment that is very different from a traditional school setting. You will benefit from small class sizes, one-to-one support and hands-on learning tailored to your course.

Introducing T Levels

T Levels are a new two-year qualification for post-GCSE students aged 16 to 19 and are equivalent to 3 A levels.

Based on the world's best technical education systems, T Levels are part of government reforms to help address the skills gap, and provide a clear range of options after GCSE. All courses have been developed with leading employers in the relevant industries to ensure that young people gain the essential knowledge and skills that businesses need.

T Levels are demanding, classroom-based, technical study programmes with industry placements that will allow you to learn what a real career is like while you study. T Level studies include around 1,800 hours of classes, industry placement and other activities over two years. Our new Animal Care and Management (T Level) course will be available from September 2024 at our Nottingham Campus.

Nottingham Campus transformation

Our 'Unlocking Potential' project has secured funding of £9 million to create new, state-of-the-art education facilities at our Nottingham Campus.

The project has been granted planning consent and funding is being supported by the Greater London Authority (GLA). The project will transform the College's facilities and significantly improve the energy efficiency of the campus, as it strives towards a zero carbon footprint, supporting the GLA's ambition for London to reach net-zero carbon by 2030.

The project will benefit over 600 people, including students, apprentices and College staff that study or work at the Nottingham Campus. The 'Unlocking Potential' project will enable the College to deliver T Levels in Animal Care and Management starting in September 2024.

How to apply

You can apply to study at Capel Manor College online at [capel.ac.uk](https://www.capel.ac.uk). It is a simple process and we advise you to apply as early as possible to secure your place.

If you are applying for a full-time course or apprenticeship you may be invited to attend an informal interview to ensure the course you have applied for is the right one for you. Following this we will normally offer you a place, depending on your qualifications or predicted grades.

You will then be able to enrol online to confirm your place at the College.

The amount you pay to study will depend upon your personal circumstances and the course you are enrolling on to. If you are aged 16 to 18 years old your course is free.

If you are aged 19 and over, some courses are free depending on your personal circumstances. Otherwise the full cost of your course will include the tuition fee, examination/registration fee and materials fee where applicable. You can apply for financial help to cover fees if you meet specific criteria, details can be found on our website.
